BEARS ARE UNDER ATTACK

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) has reversed course, shifting from protecting black bears to promoting trophy hunts. This kind of reckless wildlife management undermines decades of conservation work.

No Oversight

The FWC plans to eliminate check stations and oversight during the hunt. This lack of regulation creates opportunities for abuse and unreported violations.

Use of Bows

Bowhunting often leads to slow, agonizing deaths. Bears may be wounded and suffer for hours or even days before dying.

Baiting

Hunters lure bears with sweets, grease, or corn-filled deer feeders, turning the hunt into a baited ambush and eliminating any sense of fair chase.

Hunting with Dogs

Dogs chase and terrorize bears until they climb trees for safety only to be shot. These chases can injure non-target wildlife and leave a trail of suffering in their wake.
